MINUTES OF THE ADJOURNED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF VISTA IRRIGATION DISTRICT

April 21, 2021

An Adjourned Meeting of the Board of Directors of Vista Irrigation District was held on Wednesday, April 21, 2021 at the offices of the District, 1391 Engineer Street, Vista, California.

1. CALL TO ORDER

President Sanchez called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Directors present: Miller (arrived at 9:10 a.m.), Vásquez, Dorey, Sanchez, and MacKenzie.

Directors absent: None.

Staff present: Brett Hodgkiss, General Manager; Ramae Ogilvie, Administrative Assistant; Don Smith, Director of Water Resources; Randy Whitmann, Director of Engineering; Frank Wolinski, Director of Operations and Field Services; Marlene Kelleher, Director of Administration; and Ramae Ogilvie, Administrative Assistant. Staff present by teleconference was Lisa Soto, Secretary of the Board.

Other attendees: David Drake, representing the Association of California Water Agencies Joint Powers Insurance Authority, was present via teleconference for agenda Item 7; Scott Morris and Holly Roberson of Kronick Moskovitz Tiedemann & Girard were present for agenda Item 13.

3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

President Sanchez led the pledge of allegiance.

4. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Director of Operations and Field Services Frank Wolinski provided clarification regarding Consent Calendar Item 6.A. He stated that 5,000 linear feet of various sizes of pipe are being replaced on Vista Grande Drive because there are separate water mains feeding two pressure zones; one is a 14-inch main, and the other is an eight-inch main with four and six inch pipes coming off of them.

General Manager Brett Hodgkiss provided clarification regarding Consent Calendar Item 6.B, Special Districts Week, stating that this will be the second year in a row in which the District will adopt a resolution in support of Special Districts Week.

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7. ASSOCIATION OF CALIFORNIA WATER AGENCIES JOINT POWERS INSURANCE AUTHORITY REFUND

During the following discussion, Director Miller arrived at 9:10 a.m.

President Sanchez stated that the District was issued a refund by the Association of California Water Agencies Joint Powers Insurance Authority (ACWA JPIA) as a partial return of prior policy years' premiums due to the District's successful efforts in controlling liability and workers' compensation losses. He introduced Rincon del Diablo Municipal Water District Director David Drake who attended the meeting via teleconference on behalf of ACWA JPIA to commend the District for its successes in risk management. The Board thanked Mr. Drake for his attendance and kind words. Mr. Hodgkiss thanked the Board for its support in allocating the resources that allow staff to undertake projects and programs that improve the District's safety and reduce claims. Mr. Hodgkiss also commended staff, especially Mr. Wolinski and Safety and Risk Manager Sherry Thorpe, for their efforts.

8. MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE ACTIVITIES OF THE SAN DIEGO COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY

See staff report attached hereto.

Director Miller stated that earlier in the morning he attended a virtual meeting of the North County Water Agencies, which ran a little long causing him to be 10 minutes late. He stated that there has not been a meeting of the San Diego County Water Authority (Water Authority) Board of Directors since his last report, and the next meeting is scheduled for the following day (April 22, 2021).

Director Miller commented that he has been very active and busy as Chair of the Water Authority Administrative & Finance (A&F) Committee. One matter that has the attention of the A&F Committee is the Water Authority's new Fitch Rating, which he stated has been weakened slightly by the proposed detachment of two member agencies. He discussed other factors affecting the Water Authority's AAA rating including declining water sales.

Mr. Hodgkiss reported on the recent Member Agencies Managers meeting in which the discussion centered on COVID-19 related issues including Governor Newsome's plan to remove all restrictions as of June 15, 2021. He stated that agencies are beginning to discuss going back to in-person Board meetings and bringing staff back into the office; however, most agencies are waiting to learn more about the changes that will come on June 15 before making decisions regarding opening Board meetings and lobbies to the public and having all staff return to the workplace.

Director Miller reported on the hydrology in California and on the Colorado River. He stated the Water Authority is currently lobbying California Senator Toni Atkins to do what she can to assure that San Diego County would not be subject to drought restrictions should they be implemented statewide.

9. MEETINGS AND EVENTS

See staff report attached hereto.

Director Dorey commented that there will be a virtual meeting of the ACWA Groundwater Committee held during the upcoming virtual ACWA Conference. He stated that he plans on attending the Groundwater Committee meeting but does not plan on attending the conference at the this time. He said that if an ACWA JPIA Board meeting is held during the ACWA Conference, he will attend.

Director Vásquez reported that he attended a virtual meeting of the Council of Water Utilities (COWU) in which an excellent presentation was made by Metropolitan Water District of Southern California Assistant (MWD) General Manager Deven Upadhyay regarding Regional Planning, Infrastructure, and Reliability. Mr. Upadhyay noted that the State Water Project allocation is five percent. It was also noted in the presentation that MWD has a large amount of water in storage, which assures an adequate supply for southern California through the summer of 2021 and possibly the summer of 2022.

Director MacKenzie reported on her attendance at a meeting of the California Special Districts Association (CSDA) Finance Corporation in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Form 990 (a form required of some tax-exempt organizations as a part of their annual reporting) was reviewed. Also reviewed was the Finance Corporation's recent audit, which came back clean, the 2021 work plan, and strategies for promoting the programs offered by the Finance Corporation.

Director MacKenzie reported on a virtual meeting she attended of the CSDA Board of Directors in which routine business was conducted. Director MacKenzie reported that CSDA is in excellent financial condition and has been funding its reserves. She reported that she also attended a virtual meeting of the San Diego Chapter, CSDA (Chapter) in which the Chapter decided not to sponsor a scholarship contest this year due to challenges of promoting the contest during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Board noted and clarified that the second meeting in May will be on Tuesday, May 18, 2021 at 2:00 p.m. Director MacKenzie said that she is scheduled to attend a conference virtually that day, but intends to call in for the Board meeting. Director Miller said that he has an appointment that morning, but will also call in for the meeting if he is not able to attend in person.

Director Vásquez requested authorization, after the fact, for his attendance at the COWU meeting on April 20 and requested authorization to attend the Vista Historical Society Hall of Fame Luncheon on May 15, 2021. Director MacKenzie requested to attend the CSDA Annual Conference in Monterey, August 30 through September 2, 2021. She asked to be registered as soon as possible because space will be limited for in person attendance due to COVID-19 restrictions. President Sanchez requested to attend the CSDA Conference.

Upon motion by Director Miller, seconded by Director Dorey and unanimously carried (5 ayes: Miller, Vásquez, Dorey, MacKenzie, and Sanchez), the Board of Directors authorized the following attendances: Directors Sanchez and MacKenzie to attend the CSDA Annual Conference on August 30-September 2, 2021; Director Vasquez to attend Vista Historical Society Hall of Fame Luncheon on May 15, 2021; and Director Vásquez's virtual attendance at COWU held on April 20, 2021.

10. ITEMS FOR FUTURE AGENDAS AND/OR PRESS RELEASES

Mr. Hodgkiss stated that the Vista Irrigation District Scholarship Contest would be presented by the Public Affairs Committee at the May 5, 2021 Board meeting.

Mr. Hodgkiss clarified that the 2020 Urban Water Management Plan is due to be submitted by July 1, 2021.

Director MacKenzie requested that when the Budget is presented for the Board's consideration, following the Fiscal Policy Committee's review, that up-to-date information be included with the staff

report concerning delinquencies. Mr. Hodgkiss responded that staff track delinquencies continuously, and that he is provided a regular status report; staff will include this information with the Budget staff report as requested. Mr. Hodgkiss provided a brief overview of the status of delinquencies to date.

11. COMMENTS BY DIRECTORS

Director MacKenzie commented on a news article she read about the County of San Diego (County) received \$40 million in COVID-19 relief, and a proposal by County Supervisor Nathan Fletcher to divide it among County employees.

Director Miller reported that MWD has narrowed the field of applicants for the General Manager position and progress is being made towards a final selection to replace retiring General Manager Jeff Kightlinger.

12. COMMENTS BY GENERAL MANAGER

Mr. Hodgkiss updated the Board regarding the District's smart leak detector rebate program, which was being supported by MWD member agency administered program funding. Mr. Hodgkiss said that District has been operating its program for about five months with good success, issuing 23 rebates over that period. Mr. Hodgkiss stated that staff has recently learned that MWD is going to be offering its own device rebate program so the District's program is going to have to be discontinued effective June 1, 2021.

A brief break was taken from 10:08 a.m. to 10:10:15 a.m. Upon return from break, present in the audience were Director of Water Resources Don Smith, Scott Morris and Holly Roberson of Kronick Moskovitz Tiedemann & Girard.

13. CLOSED SESSION FOR CONFERENCE WITH LEGAL COUNSEL

President Sanchez adjourned the meeting to closed session at 10:15 a.m. for a conference with legal counsel per Paragraph (1) of subdivision (d) of Government Code section 54956.9 to discuss the following pending litigation:

SUBJECT: MATERIALS FOR MAINLINE REPLACEMENT

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Approve the purchase of pipeline materials from Core & Main for mainline replacement on Vista Grande Drive in the amount of \$280,073.17.

PRIOR BOARD ACTION: None.

FISCAL IMPACT: \$280,073.17 including tax and freight.

<u>SUMMARY</u>: The District received bids from three different vendors, Core & Main, Ferguson Waterworks and Pacific Pipeline Supply. All bids were responsive to the District's specifications; Core & Main submitted the lowest bid.

<u>DETAILED REPORT</u>: This mainline project will replace approximately 5,000 feet of 4-inch and 6-inch asbestos cement, 8-inch Nipponite and 14-inch steel pipe in Vista Grande Drive that was installed between the mid 1930's and late 1960's. Staff recommends the replacement of this main as it will eliminate a priority segment of Nipponite pipe and enhance flow capabilities to the 810 and 976 pressure zones in this area.

Materials being purchased for this project include 6-inch, 8-inch and 18-inch PVC pipe and various fittings.

Ferguson Waterworks \$289,967.89

Pacific Pipeline Supply \$300,863.56

RESOLUTION NO. 21-xx RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF VISTA IRRIGATION DISTRICT PROCLAIMING THE WEEK OF MAY16, 2021 TO MAY 22, 2021 TO BE SPECIAL DISTRICT WEEK

WHEREAS, special districts are local governmental entities created by a community's residents, funded by those residents, and overseen by those residents, to provide specialized services and infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, today, just over 2,000 independent special districts provide millions of Californians with essential services, including services related to water, sanitation and water recycling, fire protection, electricity, parks and recreation, health care, open space, ports and harbors, flood protection, mosquito abatement, cemeteries, resource conservation, airports, transit, road maintenance, veterans' facilities, and more; and

WHEREAS, special districts first arose when San Joaquin Valley farmers needed a way to access their local water supply; and

WHEREAS, under the Wright Act of 1887, the Turlock Irrigation District became California's first special district and made it possible for local farmers to intensify and diversify agriculture in California's Central Valley; and

WHEREAS, in the 20th century, special districts increased dramatically in both number and scope, and during the periods of prosperity and population growth that followed both world wars when the demand for all types of public services increased, and special districts met that need; and

WHEREAS, the statutory authorization for mosquito abatement districts was enacted in 1915 to combat the salt marsh mosquitoes around the San Francisco Bay and higher than average malaria cases in rural counties; and

WHEREAS, fire protection districts can trace their origins to a 1923 state law, and in 1931 the Legislature authorized recreation districts, the forerunners of today's recreation and park districts; and

WHEREAS, hospital districts arose in 1945 because of a statewide shortage of hospital beds. In 1994, the Legislature then expanded their breadth and renamed them health care districts in recognition of the diverse, modern needs of California's communities and the importance of proactive, affordable health care beyond the walls of a hospital building; and

WHEREAS, although originally created to provide individual services, in 1961 the Legislature authorized special districts to address multiple needs, when it provided for multipurpose, community services districts; and

WHEREAS, special districts vary in size and scope and serve diverse communities throughout California, from small rural neighborhoods, such as the Pine Cove Water District in the San Jacinto Mountains of Riverside County, to large urban regions, such as the East Bay Municipal Utility District spanning much of the Counties of Alameda and Contra Costa; and

WHEREAS, local residents own special districts and govern them through locally elected or appointed boards. A series of sunshine laws ensure special districts remain transparent and accountable to the communities they serve, as these laws require open and public meetings, public access to records, regular audits, online posting of finances and compensation, and more; and

WHEREAS, to prevent overlapping services and ensure that local agencies are operating effectively and efficiently to meet communities' needs, special districts are formed, reviewed, consolidated, or dissolved through a methodical local process that includes the oversight of a local agency formation commission and the consent of local voters; and

WHEREAS, in 1969, several independent special districts formed a statewide association called the California Special Districts Association, commonly referred to as the CSDA, to promote good governance and improved essential local services through professional development, advocacy, and other services for all types of independent special districts; and

WHEREAS, Vista Irrigation District seeks to promote democratic institutions, community-based services, local control, and self-determination; and

WHEREAS, Vista Irrigation District seeks to promote and educate the public about their local public service providers, including awareness and understanding of special districts;

NOW, THERFORE, IT BE RESOLVED by the Vista Irrigation District Board of Directors, that Vista Irrigation District hereby joins the California State Legislature in proclaiming the week of May 16, 2021 to May 22, 2021, inclusive, to be Special Districts Week and encourages all residents to be involved in their community and be civically engaged with their local government.
